Hit By a Car.....and THANKFUL!

Sometimes blessings come wrapped in crisis, pain or heartache

She was an orphan, adopted in Hong Kong by a Chinese couple who treated her like dirt. They made her their servant, belittled and shamed her, told her she was worthless and the cause of all their troubles.

So one rainy night as a teen Monica (not her real name) ran away from home and headed for the harbor to end her miserable life. As she staggered along the street, weeping, confused and bewildered, she stepped off the curb suddenly and was hit by a car driven by a missionary nurse, Ruth, who slammed on the brakes but still hit the girl hard enough to knock her to the ground. Ruth and her sister, Dortha, also a missionary nurse, rescued Monica and took her home where they nursed her back to health.

As the missionary sisters ministered to her medically, they also prayed over her and told her the amazing story of Jesus, God's eternal Son, who came to earth to save us from our sins and to give us hope in this broken world. Having been raised by Buddhist parents who taught her to worship idols and ancestors, Monica rejoiced to know the One True God and embraced the Gospel. Transformed by Amazing Grace, this Chinese teen grew strong in faith and eventually married a talented young Chinese pastor and schoolteacher. Together they planted and pastored thriving churches in Hong Kong and later in Toronto.

I had the privilege of teaching Monica's husband in the Bible college there, married them in 1970, and together we started our first Chinese church in the inner city. That church grew and planted several daughter churches in the succeeding years.

Monica looks back with **great thanksgiving** for being hit by a car many years ago, a painful rescue from suicide and the beginning of a new and fulfilling life as a born-again Christian!

Well as many of you know we recently had to bid farewell to our "big white dog" Cassie. She wandered into our yard 13 years ago an emaciated shell of a puppy. Dr. Young estimated that she was only a year old. The following years she blossomed into a 110 lb. lab mix, who amazingly got along well with all the household cats and the puppy we added to the mix four years later. Those of you who are pet lovers know the bond between you and your pets is an amazing experience. Research has now proven that we are healthier and happier when we share our lives with the unconditional love of a pet. I have personally found that rescue pets, both cats and dogs, are so appreciative of a home that they very rarely exhibit behavioral problems. Many rescue dogs are also very easy to housebreak. Cassie never had an accident in our home from the day we took her inside. Nevertheless, as we age, so do our pets. As I come in contact with folks my own age I hear the same stories of the older pet who is coming to the end of their time with us. Probably the hardest day of your life when you have a pet is making that decision. I recently read one of the best explanations of the decision making process. Think about how your pet was say 5 years ago. Were there things they enjoyed doing that have fallen by the wayside? For me I realized several months ago that Cassie had lost her strong prey drive. She no longer had the energy to lunge and bark at squirrels, geckos, golf carts or bikes. She had great difficulty getting down to a lying position and getting up was even more difficult. Her appetite had decreased and the subsequent weight loss soon became visible. She slept most of the day and spent the nights next to our bed, long gone the ability to get into the bed. All the signs it was time to say goodbye. I am grateful to a caring vet, who supported our decision and made Cassie's transition to the Rainbow Bridge a painless one. Of course, our hearts are broken, but the gift of love she gave us during her years in our lives is priceless.



November is Alzheimer's Awareness Month!

National Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month

President Ronald Reagan designated November as **National Alzheimer's Disease Awareness Month** in 1983. At the time, fewer than 2 million Americans had **Alzheimer's**; today, the number of people with the **disease** has soared to
nearly 5.4 million. **Alzheimer's is the most common form of dementia,** a general term for memory
loss and other cognitive abilities serious enough to interfere with daily life. Alzheimer's disease
accounts for 60 to 80 percent of dementia cases.

- Alzheimer's is not a normal part of aging. The greatest known risk factor is increasing age, and the majority of people with Alzheimer's are 65 and older. But Alzheimer's is not just a disease of old age. Approximately 200,000 Americans under the age of 65 have younger-onset Alzheimer's disease (also known as early-onset Alzheimer's).
- Alzheimer's worsens over time. Alzheimer's is a progressive disease, where dementia symptoms gradually worsen over a number of years. In its early stages, memory loss is mild, but with late-stage Alzheimer's, individuals lose the ability to carry on a conversation and respond to their environment. Alzheimer's is the sixth leading cause of death in the United States. Those with Alzheimer's live an average of eight years after their symptoms become noticeable to others, but survival can range from four to 20 years, depending on age and other health conditions.
- Alzheimer's has no current cure, but treatments for symptoms are available and research continues. Although current Alzheimer's treatments cannot stop Alzheimer's from progressing, they can temporarily slow the worsening of dementia symptoms and improve quality of life for those with Alzheimer's and their caregivers. Today, there is a worldwide effort under way to find better ways to treat the disease, delay its onset, and prevent it from developing.

American Diabetes Month

More than 30 million people in the United States have diabetes, but 1 out of 4 of them don't know they have it. There are three main types of diabetes: type 1, type 2, and gestational diabetes (diabetes while pregnant, which can put the pregnancy and baby at risk and lead to type 2 diabetes later).

With type 1 diabetes, your body can't make insulin (a hormone that acts like a key to let blood sugar into cells for use as energy), so you need to take it every day. Type 1 diabetes is less common than type 2 diabetes; about 5% of the people who have diabetes have type 1. Currently, no one knows how to prevent type 1 diabetes.

Most people with diabetes—9 out of 10—have type 2 diabetes. With type 2 diabetes, your body doesn't use insulin well and is unable to keep blood sugar at normal levels. If you have any of the risk factors below, ask your doctor if you should be tested for diabetes. The sooner you find out, the sooner you can start making healthy changes that will benefit you now and in the future.
