CRITTER & CORNER

Well it is hard to believe that the summer is almost upon us. December of last year, and March of this year, were record breakers for high temperature in Florida. I do not even want to think what June, July and August will bring. The summer months can be uncomfortable—even dangerous—for pets and people. It's difficult enough simply to cope with rising temperatures, let alone thick humidity.

Watch the humidity "It's important to remember that it's not just the ambient temperature but also the humidity that can affect your pet," says Dr. Barry Kellogg, VMD, "Animals pant to evaporate moisture from their lungs, which takes heat away from their body. If the humidity is too high, they are unable to cool themselves, and their temperature will skyrocket to dangerous levels—very quickly.

Never leave your pets in a parked car not even for a minute. Not even with the car running and air conditioner on. On a warm day, temperatures inside a vehicle can rise rapidly to dangerous levels. On an 85-degree day, for example, the temperature inside a car with the windows opened slightly can reach 102 degrees within 10 minutes. After 30 minutes, the temperature will reach 120 degrees. Your pet may suffer irreversible organ damage or die. If you witness a dog in a parked car, call for assistance immediately. It is beyond my comprehension how people can leave their pets, and their children, unsupervised in a locked vehicle, but I am sure we have all witnessed it from time to time.

Limit exercise on hot days Take care when exercising your pet. Adjust intensity and duration of exercise in accordance with the temperature. On very hot days, limit exercise to early morning or evening hours, and be especially careful with pets with white-colored ears, who are more susceptible to skin cancer, and short-nosed pets, who typically have difficulty breathing. Asphalt gets very hot, and can burn your pet's paws, so walk your dog on the grass if possible. Always carry water with you to keep your dog from dehydrating. Remember to keep your pet current on heartworm and flea and tick prevention. These insects love the summer months. If you choose to take your dog swimming, avoid areas of standing water. The bacteria levels in the hot summer months are much higher and can cause intestinal upset. Never let you dog swim in areas with blue/green algae, as these algae can produce toxins with severe effects on pets and people. Basically never allow your pet to swim anywhere where you wouldn't go yourself.

Keep yourself and your pet cool in these hot steamy months of summer in Florida!

Chaplain's Chat By: Rev. Bill Commons, *Resident*



How Should We live During the Pandemic?

Dr. Marvin Olasky came from a non-religious Jewish background and became a Communist while studying in a prestigious American university. Later, when he came to faith in Christ, he was transformed into a leading Christian thinker and author. After many years as a distinguished professor in the University of Texas at Austin he became a college president in NYC, and now serves as editor of WORLD magazine. Here I reference some of his thoughts on living as Bible-believers in the time of coronavirus:

Our response to the current crisis should follow what Paul wrote in <u>2 Timothy 1:7 "God gave us a</u> <u>spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control."</u> Satan has inflicted the world with a plague that some people have "without showing signs of sickness so they will distrust each other and quiver in their own homes with their own food and hand sanitizer".

This is "a disease designed in hell, breaking the bonds of community as it creates fear of everyday encounters – people can be symptomless for up to three weeks as they transmit the disease to others."

So how should Bible believers live in such a tense and fearful time? It is wise and necessary to follow physical distancing and other protocols to avoid spreading the virus, until authorities relax the guidelines. But while not shaking hands, "we should not shake with fear so we stay out of contact with each other"...we are still meant to serve one another.

"We should not be so concerned about our own health that we are afraid to be neighbors. Pay attention to the needs of the elderly. Take a meal to doctors or nurses working long hours. <u>How we react</u> to a crisis like this shows whether we belong to Christ, and the whole world is watching.

"If we merely hunker down, that is Satan's triumph. We always need to show God's love (in appropriate ways). That's especially true in the time of coronavirus."

"...<u>be servants to one another in love</u>. For the whole law can be summed up in a single commandment: LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR AS YOURSELF" (Galatians 5:13b-14, New Testament)


