CRITTER CORNER

The holidays are upon us, and once again as we look to shop for our pets we are concerned about safety. You will see many prepackaged gifts for both cats and dogs, but unfortunately many of them include items that can not only be harmful, but some are downright dangerous. For cats avoid anything with string, yarn, or hanging pieces that can be chewed off and ingested. For dogs stay away from rawhide of any kind. During the holidays they tend to make the rawhide treats appear very festive, however they are probably one of the worst chews for dogs. Also if purchasing “gourmet treats”, read the ingredients and their source carefully. Items made outside of the US can have questionable content in them.

As an alternative, I am going to offer you a very easy recipe to make for your canine friends and neighbors!

Peanut Butter Bites: Ingredients: 3 Tbsp. olive oil, ¼ c. all natural smooth peanut butter (no salt, sugar or xylitol added), ¼ c honey (not raw honey), 2 eggs, 2 Tbsp. water, 2 c. whole wheat or rice flour, 1 ½ tsp. baking powder. In a large bowl, mix all the ingredients well until the dough is stiff; if it is too sticky, mix in a small amount of flour. Knead the dough on a lightly floured surface until firm. Roll out the dough to half-inch thickness, and cut out shapes with a cookie cutter. Put the cookies on a baking sheet ½ in. apart. Bake at 350 F for 20 – 25 mins. When done, the cookie should be firm. Turn the oven off, and leave the cookies for 1 to 2 hours to harden. Yields 40 – 2 inch cookies.

You can find lots of different recipes on the internet to make wholesome treats for your dogs. Don’t discount dried fruits and raw vegetables. My dogs love carrots and asparagus! One of our neighbors makes banana chips, and they are also a huge hit.

Last, but of course not least, cautiously decorate when you have furry family members. If you happen to have added a new pet since last holiday season, it is a good idea to do the decorating in stages. For instance, I put my tree up and leave it undecorated for a few days, this way we can make certain our pups don’t think it is a new potty station. Decorations can be very festive, however, tinsel and garland are not a good idea with pets in the home.

Well from our house to yours, and Barney and Cooper, we wish you all a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

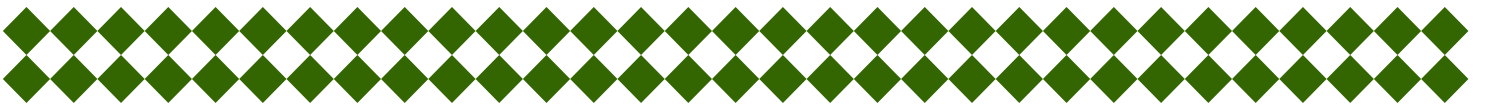

5:30 PM ~ Meet at the North Course Parking Lot for Refreshments; Masks Requested

6:00 PM ~ Santa Leaves the North Course Parking Lot for a Parade through the Community You can Join Santa there or join in the Parade as it Passes your Driveway.

7:00 PM ~ Santa arrives at Founder's Hall. Receive your Goodie Bag from your Residents Council

Stay in your Golf Cart. Receive your Goodie Bag as you pass by. Disperse from Founder's Hall Parking lot.

Luminary Instructions

You will receive 2 white bags and 2 candles.

These are your luminaries for our annual Holly Jolly Event.

On DECEMBER 12th they should be placed at the end of your driveway, one on each side, near (but not on) the street.

Fill the bag approx. 1 to 1 1/2 inches of sand or soil.

Place the candle firmly into the soil so it does not tip to the side.

Light the candle at 5:00pm for the Santa parade.

Be sure the wick of the candle is pointed up.
