2020 Food Drive Challenge Results

WOW, just WOW!

That’s the only way I can describe the generosity of Highlands Ridge residents during the Food Drive Challenge this spring. What started out to be a friendly competition between Highlands Ridge, Harder Hall, Sun N Lakes and Golf Hammock turned into an amazing event that helped so many.

When we talked about the event last fall, we had no idea we’d be facing a pandemic in the spring. Our drive could not have happened at a better time when the shelves at the Heartland Food Bank were empty and so many were in need.

We had a goal of collecting 2 tons of food between all 4 communities. What we may have thought was an aggressive goal, was blown out of the water! The final tally for each community:

Yes, you are reading that correctly – we collected over 15,000 pounds of food and Highlands Ridge, alone, contributed over 5.5 tons!

When the Food Drive started, you were given a raffle ticket for each item that was donated. Thanks to the generosity of Ann and Dirk Meyer, we purchased a \$100 gift certificate for 3 Gens Grill. Our original goal was to have the drawing in the Spring, but then the virus hit and 3 Gens Grill needed to close. Fast forward to the Fall, 3 Gens Grill is open (with limited capacity), but we should be able to hold the long overdue drawing.

The new date for the drawing will be October 30th at 6pm at 3 Gens Grill. Since your name was written on the back of your tickets, you do not need to be present to win, but we hope to see many of you there (with masks on). We have asked to have a representative of the Heartland Food Bank do the drawing. Thank you to all of the 150 households in our community that contributed.

Since this has been the year of serious health awareness, I thought I would cover a couple of topics that are not very popular.

The first is cleaning up after your dog. Over the last few months I have noticed more and more dog droppings around our community. I will say that the majority of places I go with my dogs is common ground, such as the area behind our home on clubhouse drive, the water plant, and the lots in the Golf Villas. Believe me, I don't like traipsing into the tall grass to retrieve poo any more than anyone else, however it is essential to dispose of it properly for our health and the health of our dogs. Dog feces can carry many diseases and worms. Intestinal worms in dogs in Florida is a constant battle, hence why you need a fecal exam before you can board your dog. Some of the diseases have familiar names, such as Giardia, Salmonella, Leptospira, E Coli, Parvovirus, Roundworms (which the CDC has found that 14% of Americans are affected with roundworms), and up to 23 million coliform bacteria per gram of poop! It actually pollutes waterways and is in the same EPA category as oil and mine runoff. So please pick up after your dog. This is a great place to have a dog, as everyone loves a pat and to give a cookie, but carry your biodegradable waste bags, place them in the provided receptacles, and wash well when you return home.

My next topic is about feeding wildlife, and I'm not referring to bird feeders. There have been several areas of bread left about, and recently I saw an aluminum tray full of raw vegetables and meat. "People" food isn't good for animals as it is not nutritious enough for animals and may cause serious health problems. It also makes wild animals lose their natural fear of people. Feeding can make large potentially dangerous animals become too comfortable in our neighborhoods. When wild animals become dependent on people for food it can cause injuries or spread disease. When wild animals gather for food handouts, it can cause crowding and competition. These unnatural conditions increase the chances of fighting and injury among animals. It can also increase the spread of diseases, some of which can be transmitted to pets and humans. So keep your wild animal feeding to your bird feeder. Be conscientious about keeping your feeder clean and the area around it clean as well. Then sit back and enjoy all the wonderful wildlife here in Central Florida!

Marina Cove HOA

As Summer comes close to an end, Fall emerges. Our Snowbirds will soon return, and we will continue to welcome new residents to our slice of heaven in Marina Cove. We thought this would be a good time to talk about HOA's.....What is an HOA? HOA's – the what, the who, the why, etc.

We will start with the “What”. An HOA is a Homeowner's Association. Marina Cove has its own HOA – one that would be classified as a “Neighborhood Association”. A group of neighbors who work together for changes and improvements such as neighborhood safety, beautification, seasonal decorations, and social activities which include some very successful fund-raising events. Events that Marina Cove sponsors include: Thursday Night Bingo including the Canteen and all the wonderful food that is prepared and sold that night; the “Quarter Raffle” held in Feb that generated \$5,000 in 2019 which was donated to two separate charities after expenses were paid and a small percentage to Marina Cove HOA; the food for Families Drive in November which generated not only cash but food donations in excess of 2 tons – a HUGE success; and the 2019 Halloween Party/Dance.

All persons owning mobile Homes and leasing lots are eligible for membership in the Association. Members shall pay all dues and assessments levied by the Association. Failure to make payment of these dues shall result in loss of all membership rights and privileges.

The MCHOA collects dues once a year in the amount of \$15. These dues are put in a special account managed by the Treasurer for expenditures incurred in promoting events we sponsor, (see above) maintaining Bingo supplies and equipment, buying food to prepare for the canteen for Bingo Nights and supplies for the Annual HOA Meeting which is held in March.

Marina Cove has a Board of Directors which include President Bruce Mann, Vice-President Susan Butrymowicz, Treasurer Richard Shelley, and Directors Bill Commons, Nancy Mahoney, and Norm Downing. We currently have an opening on the board for Secretary and are looking for someone that may be interested in serving. In the interim we are fortunate to have Bobbie Hutchinson acting as Assistant Secretary until a new Secretary can be found. Board meetings are held the first Tuesday of the month September through May at 10:00 am. All dues paying Marina Cove residents are encouraged to attend!!!

Distribution Center: The center has the most common forms used at Highlands Ridge. You don't have to wait for the office to open because the center is open 24/7. The boxes are labeled and are clear so you can see the form. If you don't see a form that you would like to see there, please email me with your suggestion.

Marina Cove Residents: Thank you to the residents who signed up for ACH starting in October to draft their lot rent. There were quite a few of you. I encourage all of you to sign up to draft your trash and real estate taxes as well. As of 09.28.2020, I have only received about 12 signed ACH forms to draft the trash & advalorem, while 135 of have your lot rent drafted. Hmmm... The deadline is in 2 weeks in order for me to draft your account to pay the trash invoice on October 31, 2020. The trash invoice of \$173.00 will be due October 31, 2020 and the Real Estate tax prorated share of \$127.27 will be due January 1, 2021. The form is at the distribution center labeled One-Time Authorization Agreement. Please complete this form and return to the office by October 15, 2020. Trash invoice will be drafted on October 31, 2020 and the real estate taxes invoice will be drafted on January 1, 2021. This form is also located on the website, under resident info and then under electronic debit service. If you are away, please email me or frontdesk@highlandsridge.com for the form and we will email it to you. Any questions, please call me at 863-471-1115.

REMINDERS:

- 1) We are no longer using the old MGA blended tees for our events, instead we'll be using the W/G blended, Gold and G/R blended tees on the new score cards.
- 2) When you sign up for events, you need to list the tees you play from and if you are not in the GHIN system, you need to include your index. **YOU NEED TO NOTIFY THE BOARD IF YOU WANT TO CHANGE TEES DURING THE SEASON AND YOU'LL NEED 10 SCORES FROM THOSE TEES TO DEVELOP A NEW HDCP.**
- 3) Dues are expected to stay the same (\$20) as last season. **ONLY CHECKS ARE ACCEPTED FOR DUES AND CAN BE PAID TO SAM CLINE OR LEAVE YOUR CHECK AT THE NORTH COURSE.**
- 4) If you've had a hole-in-one this summer, be sure to notify Phil Hunter and Sam Cline. If you're playing with another MGA member and get a HIO, you qualify for the \$50 payout.
- 5) The new score cards are now being used and include the new handicaps for each hole now that the courses have been rerated and tees have been repositioned.
- 6) Sign up for most MGA events at the S. Course. If there's a fee required in advance, you need to sign up and pay at the North Course.
- 7) Play with a Pro season long points from last season will be carried over to the upcoming season, since the final PWP never took place last spring.

The WELCOME BACK SCRAMBLE is a morning shotgun on Tuesday, Nov. 3 at the North Course. Your dues need to be paid any time before you play in the scramble.
