Animal News

In the past I have written several articles on having a plan in place for your pets should you be unable to care for them, for one reason or another. A few weeks ago I received a frantic call from a dear friend. Both she, and her husband, had been suffering from pneumonia, and it had progressed to a point where they had to be admitted to the hospital. She had never boarded her dogs before, and two of them have medical issues, that need to be addressed several times a day. Thankfully with the help of the "rescue village" we were able to pull together a solution. The moral of the story, have a plan, discuss your plan with reliable friends and family.

Sadly, Sebring Angels Rescue is called upon several times a month to take in a dog that was the beloved pet of someone that has passed away. The family will call and tell us that they have the pet, and although they had promised to keep it if something were to happen, circumstances had changed and that was no longer going to work. It always breaks my heart to pick up that pet, who is already grieving for their person, and now they are going to another home. We work diligently to place these dogs with adopters who have had experience with pet grief. If we get a bonded pair we do our best to keep them together as well. This is another reason to keep your pets vaccinations up to date, and to have them receiving heartworm preventative monthly. It is always easier for us to place healthy dogs, than to place dogs who are suffering from numerous medical problems.

When determining your plan don't overlook the professional boarding facilities here in Highlands County. Both The Dawg House, and Just Like Home Pet Hotel, are excellent facilities who treat your pet as if it were their own. However, before boarding they have a few requirements to keep your pet and the other guests safe. Vaccinations must be up to date including Bordetella (kennel cough) and Canine Influenza (doggie flu). In addition they will need a clear fecal test. For the safety of guests and staff their hours of drop off and pick up are scheduled. Both facilities offer tours, if you are considering including them in your emergency plan. I also recommend that you have your Emergency Pet Plan posted on your refrigerator, in a very obvious place for emergency service personnel to see. This actually gives them authority to call your pet caregiver through implied consent. Remember in the State of Florida, pets are considered property so you must make your instructions for their care clear, concise and written. Best Friends Animal Sanctuary has developed a wonderful checklist, for emergency and permanent care of your pets, which can be found on their website. If this past year has taught us anything, it is to be prepared for the unexpected.


