Spring is upon us in Florida, and along with a heavy dose of pollen and the orange blossoms, we are beginning to see new life emerge. The bears should begin to make their presence known, so it may be wise to take your bird feeder in at night. Snakes are more active as the mating season begins, as are alligators, so it is a good idea to keep your garage door closed. Small mammals are building dens and nests to have their young. I'm sure you are all seeing the baby squirrels scurrying about, they seem to have such joy in what they do! Raccoons are reproducing now and they are den dwellers, either finding a hollow opening in a tree, or an abandoned den made by another animal. One fallacy is that if you see a raccoon during daylight hours, it is sick or rabid. Actually, mother raccoons will forage for food for their babies as needed, including during the day.

Please do not trap any wild animals in the spring as you are sentencing their young to death. If you do find a baby animal, raccoon, squirrel or otherwise leave it for a few hours to see if mother returns. If this doesn't happen place the baby in a box with a soda bottle filled with very warm water. The most important thing is to keep these babies warm. Then call a licensed wildlife rehabilitator. Locally here in Highlands County we have Little Critters Rescue at 863-235-0418 or one of her licensed assistants, Carol Willey at 863-303-1286. They are prepared with the proper equipment and formula to hand raise these babies. As they get bigger and stronger they go to critter college at the rescue, where they are taught by older animals how to survive. Once mature enough, they can be returned to the wild.

We must always remember, that each member of the wildlife community plays an essential part in our ecosystem. As we have built our homes within their habitat, we often find people in conflict with them. However, by trapping or destroying these important members of our environment, we could be having a negative effect on our own survival. Please give animals the respect and space they deserve. Spring can be a beautiful time of year to quietly observe the beauty around us. Sandhill cranes share our neighborhood with their young in tow, give them the right of way. Baby rabbits may be in your bushes or lawn, don't let domestic animals frighten them, give them a chance to grow up. Slow down, smell the blossoms, hear the sounds, spring is a rebirth of so much in the world, take time to enjoy it!

Hello everyone and welcome all new residents! I know you will love living here!!

Founder's Hall Pool: The pool, spa and pool deck area will be closed April 12th through April 14th. This area will be closed to have the pool pavers pressure washed, re-sanded and sealed. Please do not come around this area during this time. The golfside villas pool will be open. Thank you for your patience during this period of maintenance.

Sealcoating Roads: The Hidden Creek village project has been postponed till management finds a new company to do the work. The contracted vendor gave notice a couple of weeks ago that he is retiring his company. Management is working hard to find a company to do the job. We will keep you updated!

Founder's Hall Memorial Path: You can still purchase a brick for \$125.00. Please email frontdesk@highlandsridge.com for the form.

Founder's Hall: is now accepting reservations. A reservation form must be completed before you can use the hall. The guidelines that residents must adhere to are the following:

- All residents must wear masks and the masks must be worn properly. (tightly fitted and covering the nose & mouth)
- All items used must be disinfected after the event/activity.
- 56 residents will be allowed at this time. A sample diagram of the hall will be supplied when the reservation is signed.
- Please call the office at 863-471-1115 to make your reservation.
- Note: Only 56 chairs will be available. The hall is monitored by cameras.

Summer Forms 2021: Please complete this form before you head back up north. This form is located in the distribution center. You may also email frontdesk@highlandsridge.com and request the form to be emailed to you.

Golf Cart Safety: Remember, you are responsible for your guests, please make sure they abide by the speed limit and stop at all stop signs. Golf carts are supposed to be driven with care and the driver should have a driver license.

Distribution Center: The center has the most common forms used at Highlands Ridge. All these forms can be found on the website www.highlandsridge.com. Click on "Resident info," then look under "Commonly Requested Forms."

Marina Cove Residents: Please remind your vendors that they can't start work till 8:00 am. It is a rule in our rules and regulations of Marina Cove.

Friendly reminders:

1. Stop at all stop signs.
2. Speed limit is 20 mph.
3. Pets must be on a leash at all times and under control.
4. No signage other than a "for sale or for lease."
(this includes political signs)
5. MUST have prior approval before performing any type of work on the exterior of your home!
6. ALL golf cart drivers must be at least 16 yrs. of age to drive a golf cart within the community.
7. Do not drive through anyone else's yard except for your own with your golf cart or vehicle!

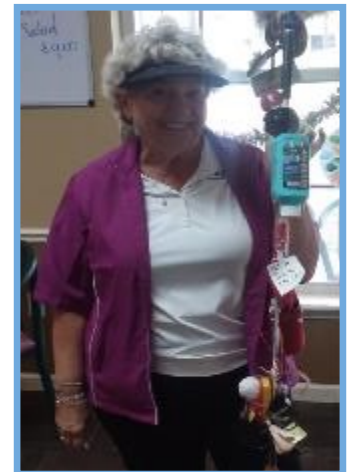
