### **Animal News**

Recently I saw a baby alligator at the head of the canal near founder's hall. It made me curious as to their development from the clutch (nest) of eggs...... here is what I found. Hope you find it as interesting as I did.


"In summer, the female builds a nest of vegetation where the decomposition of the vegetation provides the heat needed to incubate the eggs. The sex of the offspring is <u>determined by the temperature</u> in the nest and is fixed within seven to 21 days of the start of incubation. Incubation temperatures of 30 °C (86 °F) or lower produce a clutch of females; those of 34 °C (93 °F) or higher produce entirely males. Nests constructed on leaves are hotter than those constructed on wet marsh, so the former tend to

produce males and the latter, females. The baby alligator's <u>egg tooth</u> helps it get out of its egg during hatching time. The natural sex ratio at hatching is five females to one male. Females hatched from eggs incubated at 30 °C (86 °F) weigh significantly more than males hatched from eggs incubated at 34 °C

(93 °F). The mother defends the nest from predators and assists the hatchlings to water. She will provide protection to the young for about a year if they remain in the area. Adult alligators regularly cannibalize younger individuals, though estimates of the rate of cannibalism vary widely. In the past, immediately following the outlawing of alligator <u>hunting</u>, populations rebounded quickly due to the

suppressed number of adults preying upon juveniles, increasing survival among the young alligators."

I certainly found this interesting. Hard to believe that these interesting creatures have been around for 37 million years! If you would like more info on our reptilian neighbors a visit to Gatorama on US 27 south in Palmdale is a very educational experience. Great trip for the grandkids when they come to visit. Another great way to see alligators in their natural habitat is to book an airboat ride on Lake Istokpoga with John Scott of Airboat Wildlife Adventures, 863-655-4737. You'll see some wonderful wildlife and John will give you lots of history of the area. Take some time this winter to enjoy the uniqueness of Highlands County!

Hello everyone and welcome all new residents!

If you haven't been down to Founder's Hall pool area lately, then please do so. The pool looks fabulous. We spruced up the landscaping as well around the pool. The area definitely looks like Paradise!!

Both lawn mowing companies will start mowing every other week starting in November of 2021. The schedule will continue to the end of April of 2022.

**RV/Boat Storage Area:** Invoices will be emailed out on or around December 1, 2021. The rates will stay the same as last year. \$400 plus tax for the small spaces (South lot) and \$550 plus tax for the large spaces (North lot.)

**Marina Cove Residents:** The annual trash invoice of \$173.00 was due on October 31, 2021. There will be a \$45.00 late fee charged if not paid. The ad valorem of \$116.60 is due by January 1, 2022. It is not to late to have the ad valorem charge drafted out of your bank account. Please call the office for more information.

**Founder's Hall Memorial Path:** You can still purchase a brick for \$125.00. Please email frontdesk@highlandsridge.com for the form.

**Golf Cart Safety:** Remember, you are responsible for your guests, please make sure they abide by the speed limit and stop at all stop signs. Golf carts are supposed to be driven with care and the driver should have a driver license.

**Distribution Center:** The center has the most common forms used at Highlands Ridge. All these forms can be found on the website www.highlandsridge.com. Click on "Resident info," then look under "Commonly Requested Forms."

### Rules and regulations that are listed in your Prospectus or Covenants:

- 1. Stop at all stop signs.
- 2. Speed limit is 20 mph.
- 3. Pets must be on a leash at all times and under control.
- 4. No signage other than a "for sale or for lease." (this includes political signs)
- 5. MUST have prior approval before performing any type of work on the exterior of your home!
- 6. ALL golf cart drivers must be at least 16 yrs. of age to drive a golf cart within the community.
- 7. Do not drive through anyone else's yard except for your own with your golf cart or vehicle!

#### JOIN THE FUN!

#### PLAY BY THE RULES:

Rule 6.3a says: A player may play any conforming ball when starting a hole from the teeing area and may change balls between two holes.

The player must hole out with the same ball played from the teeing area, **except** when:

That ball is lost or comes to rest out of bounds, or

The player substitutes another ball (whether or not allowed to do so).

The player **should** put an identifying mark on the ball to be played.

NOTE: If a substitution is made when not allowed, the player will incur the general penalty in stroke play which is two strokes and continue play with the incorrectly substituted ball.

Examples of when substitution is allowed would be when taking relief under a rule or when playing again from where the previous stroke was played.
