Here at Critter Corner we try to cover timely animal topics and some practical tips about dog ownership here in Florida. For our newcomers be sure to give your pup their heartworm prevention year round when wintering here. Sadly heartworm in a serious problem in the warm winter climate. Also be certain to have your pet microchipped. The county animal services, located on Haywood Taylor Blvd., across from the race track does microchipping for \$10. Doggie etiquette is very important when sharing your common areas with others. Please be sure to clean up after your dog, not only on others lawns, but in common areas too. Vacant lots are considered common areas. This is a very important step in keeping your dog healthy. Parasites can multiply quickly in pet droppings. Thankfully we have several drop stains located throughout the community.

Finally as you prepare for the holidays remember to keep your pet safe from decorations, foods they cannot eat and especially unsafe treats. Many treats sold here, especially the festive ones sold during the holidays, are made in China and are not safe for our pups. Rawhide is one of those! Instead do a Pinterest search for dog treat recipes and really surprise your dog with something healthy. Some of my dogs favorite kitchen treats are carrots, fresh raw green beans, asparagus, cooked sweet potatoes, broccoli and the #1 favorite is watermelon and blueberries! 
Founder's Hall Memorial Path: You can still purchase a brick for \$125.00. Please email frontdesk@highlandsridge.com for the form.


Marina Cove HOA

Along with those cheerful thoughts comes one of Highland's Ridge favorite events. The Quarter Raffle will be returning February 13th next year. What is the Quarter Raffle? It's a Marina Cove sponsored fund raising event for a charity of our choice. It's an opportunity to be involved in an event that is fun for one and all. How does it work? First off, you need to buy a ticket. The tickets are \$5.00 and sold only before the event – there are NO SALES at the door. When you arrive to Founder's Hall, you turn in your ticket, pick a numbered hand held paddle and it's corresponding numbered ping pong ball. This event somewhat resembles a Silent Auction. There is also a \$50 paddle that is sold either ahead of time or at the event that allows you to take a chance on every single item. And most importantly, remember this is all for a good cause. You will want to find seating. 


