

Animal News

It is so fascinating to watch nature respond to the change in seasons. Those who don't live in Florida think we only have one season year round, but this year has certainly proved them wrong. I often joke that we have seasons, warm, warmer, hot and very hot. But all kidding aside, you can walk in our community and see the change in seasons. Fall brings a blanket of acorns, winter often does natures pruning of grass and shrubbery, spring brings a vibrant shade of green to some trees and a smell of orange blossoms, summer... well lets just say it brings bright sun and strong thunderstorms.

Wildlife has always fascinated me, and I love to observe their understanding of the changing seasons by the the length of the days. The last few weeks, sand hill cranes have been dancing about, crows, hawks, turkey vultures and other birds have been busy flying around with nesting materials. Squirrels have been chasing one another in their own mating ritual. Nocturnal animals can be observed after dark, scurring about preparing for the birth of new life as well. Respecting their space, and giving them room to perform these rituals is so important. Drive a bit slower, take the time to watch them. Dashing about as humans often do, cause you to miss so much that nature has to offer. Evenings often bring the sound of owls calling to one another, and alligators moving from one body of water to another, in search of a mate. Even the little geckos can be observed in a mating dance. Bears begin to reappear, and you may be lucky enough to catch sight of a Florida Panther or Bobcat. The Red Fox, another neighborhood resident, that I often see darting across the entrance road in the evening.

Having offspring to feed, and attend to, sometimes means that nocturnal animals may be seen during daylight hours. This is particularly true of raccoons, oppossums, and armadillos. To forage for food, and have enough to feed a large brood, may often require hunting during the day. Do not fear seeing these animals during the day, just give them the space they need to do their grocery shopping. Remember that oppossums and armadillos are natures exterminators, foraging for the bugs that eat your lawns and shrubs. Instead of trying to trap and relocate them, which is usually a death sentence for them, and most cerainly their young, let them do your bug cleanup for you.

The new nature trails up in the Golf Villas will also give you yet another perspective of Florida life. Different plants, song birds, a winding brook, and just the silence is peaceful and healing. Spring brings hope, as life abounds. As my Dad used to tell me, stop, listen to the silence, and breathe, to rejuvenate your mind, body and soul.



Hello everyone and welcome all new residents!

We have a first come, first serve policy when it comes to reserving tables at any of our activities/events. Do not come into the office saying, "I always have this table." We will not make any exceptions on this policy! Once an activity/event has been held, you may inquire about reserving a table for next year's activity/event.

Tennis Courts: HRH management signed an agreement in January of 2022 to have the tennis court's fence repaired. The vendor is scheduled to be here the week of March 28, 2022.

Marina Cove Residents: A management request form must be submitted to the administrative office for any type of exterior change to your home or lot per the Rules and Regulations. The request must be presented in writing prior to executing a contract with a vendor or performing any change. Please allow at least two weeks to review and research your request. Forms are available at the community information center board, online on our website, highlandsridge.com and in the administrative office. All concerns/issues must be submitted in writing. The rules and regulations state, "Two flags per home maybe installed on a single flag pole in front yard or a flag holder on garage." You must have management's prior approval before the installation.

Rules and regulations that are listed in your Prospectus or Covenants:

- 1. Stop at all stop Signs.
- 2. Speed limit is 20 mph.
- 3. Pets must be on a leash at all times and under control.
- 4. No signage other than a "for sale or for lease." (this includes political signs)
- 5. MUST have prior approval before performing any type of work on the exterior of your home!
- 6. ALL golf cart drivers must be at least 16 yrs. of age to drive a golf cart within the community.
- 7. Do not drive through anyone else's yard except for your own with your golf cart or vehicle!

RULES CORNER:

This section has included discussion about <u>free</u> relief from abnormal course conditions such as immovable obstructions, dangerous animal conditions and embedded balls.

An important point to remember is that <u>free</u> relief from the condition is not allowed when playing the ball as it lies is clearly unreasonable due to something other that the abnormal condition such as the ball lying in a bush or the ball lying between two trees which would not allow a swing. In those cases, the player would declare the ball unplayable and proceed under penalty of one stroke and put the ball or another ball in play under one of the unplayable ball options. A ball can be declared unplayable anywhere except in a penalty area.
