

Marina Cove Residents: A management request form must be submitted to the administrative office for any type of exterior change to your home or lot per the Rules and Regulations. The request must be presented in writing prior to executing a contract with a vendor or performing any change. Please allow at least two weeks to review and research your request. Forms are available at the community information center board, online on our website, highlandsridge.com and in the administrative office. All concerns/ issues must be submitted in writing. The rules and regulations state, "Two flags per home maybe installed on a single flag pole in front yard or a flag holder on garage." You must have management's prior approval before the installation.

Rules and regulations that are listed in your Prospectus or Covenants:

- 1. Stop at all stop Signs.
- 2. Speed limit is 20 mph.
- 3. Pets must be on a leash at all times and under control.
- 4. No signage other than a "for sale or for lease." (this includes political signs)
- 5. MUST have prior approval before performing any type of work on the exterior of your home!
- 6. ALL golf cart drivers must be at least 16 yrs. of age to drive a golf cart within the community.
- 7. Do not drive through anyone else's yard except for your own with your golf cart or vehicle!
