

CPI Information: The CPI can be found at BLS.gov. The Covenants and the Prospectus of Marina Cove both state in their documents that the monthly fee or lot rent can be increased according to the CPI. Any questions regarding the CPI, please call your HOA and they will contact me.

Marina Cove Residents: The annual CPI letter and the pass-through charges invoice will be mailed out around September 21, 2022. The CPI increase of 8.5% will be passed and take effect on January 1, 2023. The trash invoice of \$210.00 is due by October 31, 2022. The ad-valorem of \$138.19 is due by January 1, 2023. Both amounts of \$210.00 & \$138.19 can be taken out through ACH on the exact due dates. Please sign the form that will be mailed with these invoices and return to the office. Any questions regarding this subject matter, please call the administrative office at 863-471-1115.

Rules and regulations that are listed in your Prospectus or Covenants:

- 1. Stop at all stop Signs.
- 2. Speed limit is 20 mph.
- 3. Pets must be on a leash at all times and under control.
- 4. No signage other than a "for sale or for lease." (this includes political signs)
- 5. MUST have prior approval before performing any type of work on the exterior of your home!
- 6. ALL golf cart drivers must be at least 16 yrs. of age to drive a golf cart within the community.
- 7. Do not drive through anyone else's yard except for your own with your golf cart or vehicle!
