- 2. Pickleball has been recognized by the Sports and Fitness Industry Association as the fastest growing sport in the U.S. In the past 6 years there has been a 600% increase in the number of pickleball players.
- 3. The sport is suitable for all ages (over 70% of players are over 60 years of age)
- 4. There are over 38,000 pickleball courts in the U.S.
- 5. The sport is a combination of tennis, badminton and ping pong.
- 6. The first U.S. Pickleball national championship was held in 2016; in 2021 CBS was the first major network to televise the U.S. Pickleball Championship.
- 7. Pickleball is very affordable to play; average cost of a paddle is \$50 \$75.

- 9. The IFP is looking at obtaining recognition from the Olympic Committee to make pickleball an Olympic event.
- 10. Pickleball is great to improve cognitive function and hand-eye coordination.
- 11. Pickleball is FUN.

If you haven't informed the Admin office that you are back, please stop by the office, email, or call us to let us know you're back.

Gazette: Please remember any items submitted to the Gazette are to be sent to gazette@highlandsridge.com and by the 20th of the prior month's publication.

Marina Cove Residents: A management request form must be submitted to the administrative office for any type of exterior change to your home or lot per the Rules and Regulations. The request must be presented in writing prior to executing a contract with a vendor or performing any change. Please allow at least two weeks to review and research your request. Forms are available at the community information center board, online on our website, highlandsridge.com and in the administrative office. All concerns/issues must be submitted in writing. The rules and regulations state, "Two flags per home maybe installed on a single flag pole in front yard or a flag holder on garage." You must have management's prior approval before the installation.

Bocce Ball Courts: The bocce ball courts have been resurfaced and new court material was added.

Golf Villa Pool: The Golf Villa pool deck will be having maintenance done in the first week of December. The cracks around the decking will be repaired and the surface will be repainted. New pool rail covers are being installed at both pools and Founder's Hal Spa.

RV Storage Lot: In December all storage lot invoices will be sent out with new agreements that are due by December 31st. All lots have been restriped and numbered.

Rules and Regulations for Pets: All pets must be kept under control at all times, must on a leash no longer than 15 feet when walked and never be tied to the outside of the home. Pets are not permitted in the <u>clubhouse or other</u> recreational facility areas. Pets are not permitted on any lot, other than the owner's. Any pet excrement must be cleaned up by the owner immediately.

Drop Boxes: There are 3 drop boxes located in front of Founder's Hall for all residents to utilize when dropping off payments, documents, or forms.

Due to the increase in Covid cases throughout the community, Management is asking all residents to wear mask inside all rooms and facilities. Before leaving any room, please make sure to wipe down and sanitize any tables or items used. Cleaning supplies have been supplied in each room.


