Animal NewsSubmitted by: Denise Beauparlant, *Resident***CRITTER CORNER****SEEN DURING THE DAY?**

Seeing a nocturnal animal out during the day means no more than seeing a human out at night. Just like humans are sometimes awake at night, these animals who are opportunistic, are sometimes awake during the day, and that means nothing.

What to do if you see a “nocturnal” animal during the day? NOTHING!

The worst part about the “nocturnal myth”, is that when people see these animals during the day they assume that there is something wrong with the animal. This means they are automatically afraid of it and many will at that point shoot, or do other horrible things to the animal.

Raccoons and foxes are NOT nocturnal, they are opportunistic scavengers and that means they are awake anytime food is most easily available.

The best thing you can do is walk away. leave the animals alone. It may be gathering food for its babies. While you should not approach wildlife, you also don't need to fear them simply based on the time of day you see them. Keep a safe distance and enjoy the sights.

I would like to touch on one more topic this month and that is the Sandhill Cranes. Recently I have witnessed persons, one in a personally owned golf cart and one in a vehicle, harass, chase and in one instance attempt to hit a Sandhill crane. Please be advised that these birds are protected by the U.S. Migratory Bird Treaty Act and as a State Designated Threatened species by Florida's Endangered and Threatened Species Rule. I have reported the license plate number of the vehicle and the address of the golf cart to the Florida Fish and Wildlife Officer for this region. I encourage anyone who witnesses acts of this kind to do the same. We are very blessed to live in such a beautiful area and to share our space with these majestic birds. Watching them raise their families in our yards is a privilege not many people experience.

Pickleball Club

Highlands County Pickleball is experiencing explosive growth. This growth is not unique to Highlands County. A 2022 report from Sports Fitness Association stated the number of pickleball courts in the U.S. has more than doubled in the past 5 years (currently over 35,000 courts in the U.S.).

Municipalities nationwide are trying to meet the demand for pickleball. To assist with this demand the USA Pickleball Association has put together a tool kit for community planners with guidelines and cost estimates for building courts.

The Highland Ridge Pickleball Club currently consists of over 50 members. Our members have seen an increase in pickleball opportunities in Highlands County. On January 13th and 14th, the Heartland County Senior Games were held at Sun N Lakes Pickleball Facility. Pixie Koenig and Phyllis Sippel won gold in their division while Sue Schinderle and Arlene Taylor won silver and Gary and Sue Schinderle took home bronze.

The ladies in our pickleball club have formed a team and will be playing against other teams in our area. On 1-16-23 the team (Suzanne S, Sue I, Pixie K, Jill T, Alicia A, Deb K, Theresa M, Karen D, and Ingrid M traveled to Del Webb and won the match. Final Score was 33 to 26.

Six months ago, the Sebring Pickleball Club was formed. The purpose of this club is to bring awareness of pickleball in our community and provide members with opportunities to participate in programs designed to improve their pickleball skills. Several members from the Highlands Ridge Club have joined the Sebring Club.

This Fall the city of Sebring approved the construction of six new pickleball courts. The courts will be completed this Spring. Location will be at Charlie Brown Park. The courts will offer unlimited play at no cost.

Sun N Lakes currently has 8 courts and have approved the addition of 6 more courts. For \$25 a month a person will have unlimited play.

The Country Club of Sebring will soon have 8 new pickleball courts.

A partial listing of courts in our county includes: Buttonwood Bay (6 courts); Adelaide Shores (4 new courts); Tanglewood (8 courts); Avon Park Community Center; Bonnet Lake, Reflections and Lake Josephine.

Florida is the pickleball capital of the world. From 2020 to 2023 over 737,000 people moved to Florida (more than any other state).

Pickleball is here to stay and communities in Florida are stepping up to meet the challenge of this phenomenal growth.

**The Ridge Report**

Gazette: Please remember any items submitted to the Gazette are to be sent to gazette@highlandsridge.com and by the 20th of the prior month's publication.

Marina Cove Residents: A management request form must be submitted to the administrative office for any type of exterior change to your home or lot per the Rules and Regulations. The request must be presented in writing prior to executing a contract with a vendor or performing any change. Please allow at least two weeks to review and research your request. Forms are available at the community information center board, online on our website, highlandsridge.com and in the administrative office. All concerns/issues must be submitted in writing. The rules and regulations state, "Two flags per home maybe installed on a single flag pole in front yard or a flag holder on garage." You must have management's prior approval before the installation.

Entrance Gates: Both the South and North entrance gates have been repaired and tested. Please check the battery in your gate clicker to ensure it is working properly. The gates will open at 6 am and close at 7 pm every day. When a guest arrives after hours they will call from the gate system and residents must hit #9 to let their guest into the gates. If your code does not work please contact the Admin Office during business hours.

Library: A new bookcase and two new desk chairs have been purchased and placed in the library. The library is currently only accepting books with a copy write date of 2010 or newer. Please contact a library volunteer or the Admin Office before dropping off large amounts of books.

Yard Debris Dumpsters: The yard debris dumpsters are for yard debris only. No household trash is to be dumped into the dumpsters. The North Course dumpster has been moved to the RV lot next to the existing ones. The reasoning for this is, the dumpster is causing property damage when being emptied and replaced, the property that is currently sits on is not owned by Highlands Ridge Holdings. The other reasoning for moving the dumpster is, there are water valves in the ground next to the dumpster that keep getting damaged from people driving over them with golf carts and vehicles.

Notary Services: An appointment must be made with the Admin Office for all notary services. Notary services will be available on Tuesdays and Thursdays by appointment only.

Drop Boxes: There are 3 drop boxes located in front of Founder's Hall for all residents to utilize when dropping off payments, documents, or forms.

Tennis Court Parking/Basketball Court: Tuesday, January 10th , DMI resurfaced the Tennis Court Parking lot/basketball area. We will be restriping the area within the next week or two.

Pool Table: To reserve the pool table, please contact the Admin Office. There are groups and clubs who have reserved times in AR 1, during these events the pool tables will be unavailable.
