"Every Note Played" by Lisa Genova

It captivates with the painful but unflinching story of the demise of celebrated concert pianist Richard Evans.

The novel follows debonair Richard and his ex-wife Karina, once also a pianist, who have just undergone an acrimonious divorce after a long-poisoned marriage.

Richard's sudden diagnosis with ALS and swift decline bring them under the same roof again as Karina moves back to take care of him,

forcing them to confront long-buried truths about their relationship and themselves.

The detail Genova infuses into each narrator's thought process, observations, and love for music makes them distinct, yet also reveals their compatibility. Genova also admirably refrains from making either too angelic; their harrowing journey, though it lacks any true narrative surprises, is both substantively informative about ALS and an emotionally wrenching psychological portrait.

Distribution Boxes: Commonly requested forms and information can be found at the boxes during and after business hours for all residents. Please check the boxes for updates.

Library: Please do not change any setting on the printer in the library. If you need assistance, come by the Admin Office during business hours. Make sure to sign out of all websites or emails and clean up the area before leaving.

Yard Debris Dumpsters: The yard debris dumpsters are for yard debris only. No household trash is to be dumped into the dumpsters. The North Course dumpster has been moved to the cul de sac on North Course

Notary Services: An appointment must be made with the Admin Office for all notary services. Notary services will be available on Tuesdays and Thursdays by appointment only.

Drop Boxes: There are 3 drop boxes located in front of Founder's Hall for all residents to utilize when dropping off payments, documents, or forms.

Tennis Court Parking/Basketball Court: The stripping on the Basketball court and parking area have been completed.
